### January Modules

**BLIT 630**      **Topics in Biblical Studies: 1 & 2 Peter and Jude**  
**Dr. Dan Powers**      **Professor of Bible, Nazarene Bible College**

*This course is an intensive seminar focusing upon a study of the exegesis, theology, and homiletical value of 1 and 2 Peter and Jude.*

**CHED 631**      **Ministry to the Family**  
**Dr. Michelle Anthony**      **Family Ministry Ambassador, RockHarbor Church**

*A study of the unique characteristics and needs of contemporary families. The class will focus on developing the student's ability to provide effective ministry to families in the local church.*

**CMIN 631**      **Life Management & Personal Renewal**  
**Dr. Michael Benson**      **Director of Church & University Relations – ONU**

*This course explores the significance of spiritual development and personal renewal in the life of a leader, with attention to practice and implementation as well as strategies for modeling/teaching healthy leadership patterns.*

**YMIN 650**      **Spiritual Development of Students**  
**Mark Holcomb**      **University Chaplain – ONU**

*Learners will develop a holistic approach to the spiritual formation of their students. They will seek to answer questions about formative components to the spiritual development of students.*

**CMIN 624**      **Cross-Cultural Ministry**  
**Karen Young**      **Salvation Army**

*This course explores the fundamentals of intercultural communication while engaging participants in experiences designed to develop competencies needed for leadership in multicultural settings.*

**CMIN 635**      **Leadership in Christian Ministry**  
**Dr. Ron Lush**      **Director of the Multi-Campus Seminary – NTS  
 President, Global Initiatives Inc.**

*By examining and identifying the core principles & best practices of leadership under the authority of Scripture, and applying those to their specific context, the student's capacity for effective Christ-like leadership will be enhanced.*

**CMIN 652**      **Principles of Management**  
**Major Abran Tamayo**      **Corps Officer—Salvation Army**

*Management issues are explored including authority and ethics, conflict management, team-building theory, finances, personnel, and time management.*

**CMIN 653**      **Discipling**  
**Captain Sheila Davisson**      **Salvation Army**

*The purpose of this course is to develop students who effectively live a discipling lifestyle and are empowered to plan and implement discipling strategies.*

**CMIN 654**      **Introduction to Counseling**  
**Major Larry Thorson**      **Corps Officer—Salvation Army**

*This course reviews principles and practices of Christian & pastoral counseling with emphases on counseling for common personal and emotional issues. Special attention is given to ethical issues, counseling parameters, intercultural competence, etc. Students learn self-awareness and self-care techniques along with short term intervention strategies.*

**THEO 607**      **Theology of Ministry**  
**Dr. Carl Leth**      **with Dr. Craig Dillman**

*Students will learn the importance of theologically informed patterns of ministry and pastoral leadership and develop their own models for ministry that are intelligent and theologically informed.*

**YMIN 612**      **Foundations of Youth Ministry**  
**Rev. Duffy Robbins**      **Professor of Youth Ministry—Eastern University**

*The student will begin development of a master plan for youth ministry, focusing on the study of adolescent spirituality and discipleship, a team-based approach to ministry, and the development of a Biblical theology.*

- ◆ Module courses are excellent opportunities for those looking for graduate degree credit or as continuing education.
