## *January Module Course Descriptions & Instructor Bios*

### **BLIT 630 – Topics in Biblical Studies: Exegetical, Theological, and Homiletical Issues in 1 & 2 Peter and Jude**

***Instructor: Dan Powers***

This course is an intensive seminar focusing upon a study of the exegesis, theology, and homiletical value of 1 and 2 Peter and Jude. It involves pre-session readings and assignments, dialogue and assignments during the class sessions, and a post-session written research project.

***(Can be used as a BLIT Elective course for any program)***

### **CHED 631 – Ministry to the Family**

***Instructor: Dr. Michelle Anthony***

This course will focus on the relationship between spirituality and the family. We will pay special attention to the role of parents in the spiritual development of the family, as well as discover family dynamics that foster spiritually healthy families. Our goal is to develop the students' ability to provide effective ministry to families in the local church.

***(Required course for M.A. in Family Ministry)***

### **CMIN 631 – Life Management & Personal Renewal**

***Instructor: Dr. Michael Benson***

This course explores the significance of spiritual development and personal renewal in the life of a leader, with attention to practice and implementation as well as strategies for modeling and teaching healthy patterns as leaders.

***(Required course for Master of Ministry and M.A.'s in Pastoral and Christian Ministry)***

### **YMIN 650 – Spiritual Development of Students**

***Instructor: Chaplain Mark Holcomb***

The purpose of this course is to expose the student to the broad issues facing youth ministry today. The course will examine the landscape of youth ministry by looking at adolescent development and secular culture, and will also navigate this terrain by developing a blueprint for local church ministry. Adolescent spirituality and discipleship, a team-based approach to ministry, and the development of a biblical theology as the compass for youth ministry will also be discussed.

***(Required course for M.A. in Youth Ministry)***

**Dr. Michelle Anthony** is a native Californian and has lived in Southern Orange County for the past 20 years along with her husband, Michael, and her two children Chantel and Brendon. Michelle earned her B.A. from BIOLA University in Christian Education and her M.A. in Christian Education with an emphasis in Theology from Talbot School of Theology, and her Doctorate in Educational Leadership from Southern Seminary. She has over 25 years of practical church ministry/leadership experience and is currently serving as the Family Ministry Architect for David C. Cook Publishing. She has written over a dozen resources in Children's/Youth/Family ministries, including *Spiritual Parenting: An Awakening for Today's Families*, *The Big God Story*, and *A Theology for Family Ministries*. Michelle enjoys teaching, speaking, and serving in missions abroad. In her free time, Michelle enjoys boating, the beach, being with her family, and a good cup of coffee while reading a book.

**Dr. Michael Benson** is Olivet Nazarene University's Director of Church and University Relations for the state of Indiana. He holds degrees from Southern Nazarene University (B.A.), Nazarene Theological Seminary (M.Div.), and Asbury Theological Seminary (D.Min.). He has held ministry assignments at churches in Tennessee, Kansas, Colorado, and California and as University Chaplain at Olivet; and has conducted hundreds of revivals, retreats, and camp meetings. He also co-authored the book *Disciplines for the Inner Life*, and has written numerous articles, newspaper columns, and website features.

**Chaplain Mark Holcomb** is Chaplain to the University and Assistant Professor of Christian Education in the School of Theology & Christian Ministry at Olivet. He teaches courses in Christian formation, youth ministry, and Christian ministry. He is also the program director for Olivet's M.A. and M.Min. in Youth Ministry. In 2002, Professor Holcomb received the Timothy Award. He was elected president of Global Nazarene Youth International in 2009. He has written devotionals and articles for Barefoot Publishing. His personal interests include reading, basketball, cycling, snow skiing, laying on the beach, and walks with his wife, Terry. They live in Bourbonnais and have two daughters and sons-in-law and three grandsons.

**Dr. Daniel Powers** is Professor of Bible at Nazarene Bible College. He has also served as Bible Lecturer at European Nazarene College in Switzerland. This ordained elder in the Church of the Nazarene holds a B.A. in Philosophy/Theology from Point Loma College (now PLNU), an M.Div. from Nazarene Theological Seminary, and a PH.D. in New Testament exegesis from Leiden University. Dr. Powers has previously lived, preached, and taught in both Holland and Switzerland, worked with the Salvation Army in Nuremberg, Germany, and pastored on the Sacramento Nazarene district in Davis, California. He has four children and currently resides in the Colorado Springs area with his wife, Mieke.
